

# City's growth policy ups pressure on housing

There are a number of large brownfield sites coming forward within Oxford City. These are being prioritised for employment which means that the pressure on housing supply in the City will increase.

CPRE Oxfordshire believes these sites should instead be focused on providing high quality, high density housing. This would help to meet local need and take the pressure off the Oxford Green Belt, keeping it as a valuable resource for all Oxford residents.

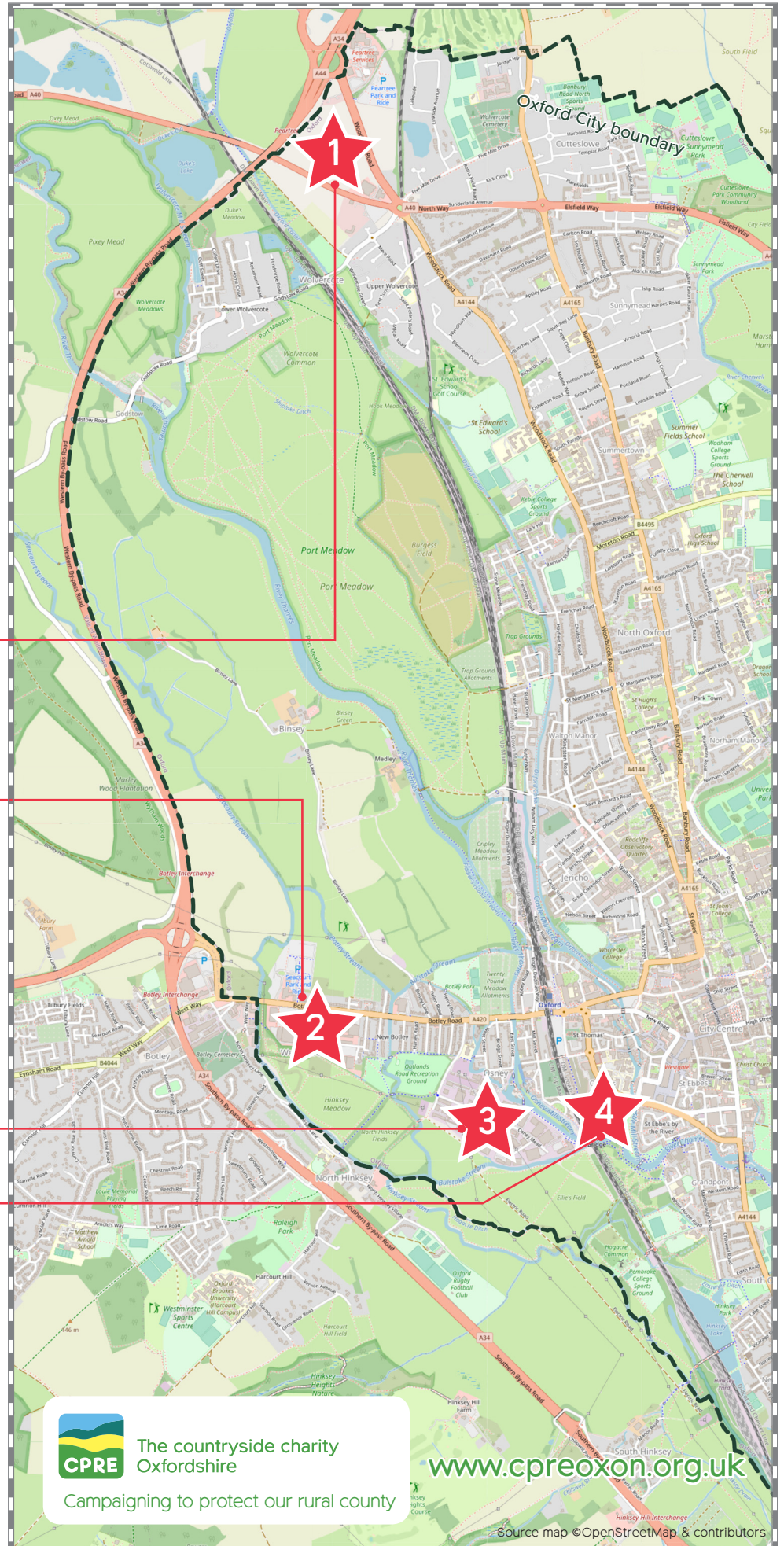
